# EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

California has some of the highest euthanasia rates in the country. While the task is daunting, Valley Oak SPCA is determined to make a difference, and it has to start in our own backyard. The Central Valley's stray, abandoned, abused and neglected animals are an epidemic.

2018 brought us a significant increase in major medical cases. Most of these animals have suffered from neglect or have been injured at the hands of humans. Many of these heartbreaking cases could have been easily prevented by simply spaying or neutering a pet or purchasing flea/tick preventative.

In order to reduce the suffering of animals in our community,

Valley Oak SPCA has dedicated their time and resources to help pet owners who don't have access to veterinary care.

We continue to offer high quality, high quantity, spay and neuter surgeries as well as dozens of other veterinary services and procedures.

We are constantly heading out on rescue missions to save animals that have been abandoned and left to fend for themselves.

We regularly pull animals from the overcrowded municipal shelters into our rescue and provide medical care and rehabilitation until they are placed in a loving forever home.

In the following pages you will find proof that a small but determined crew really CAN make a difference in the lives of thousands of animals.

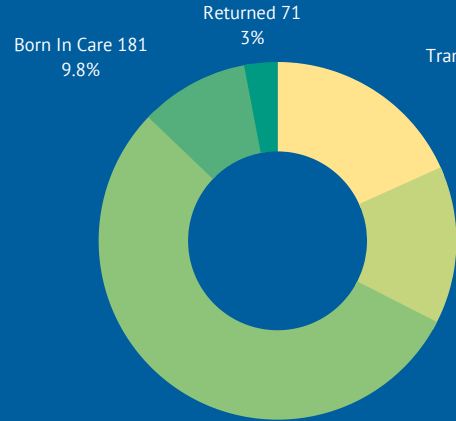
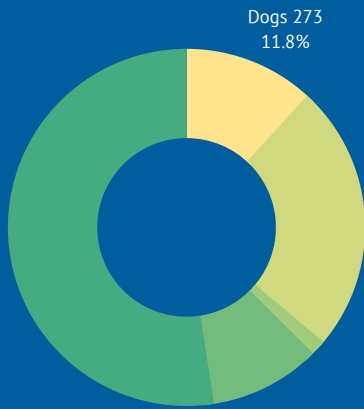

# 2018 INCOMING ANIMALS

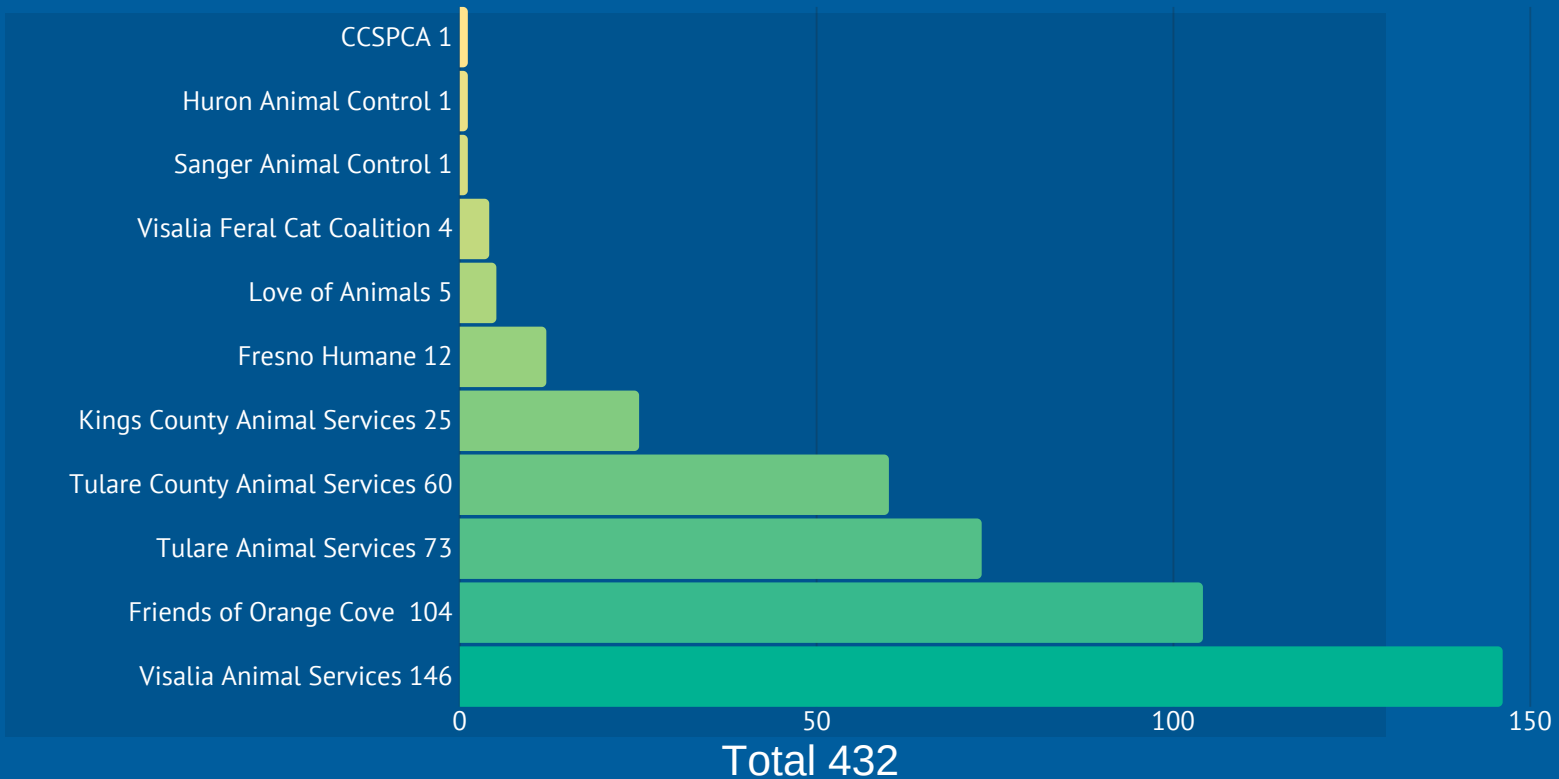

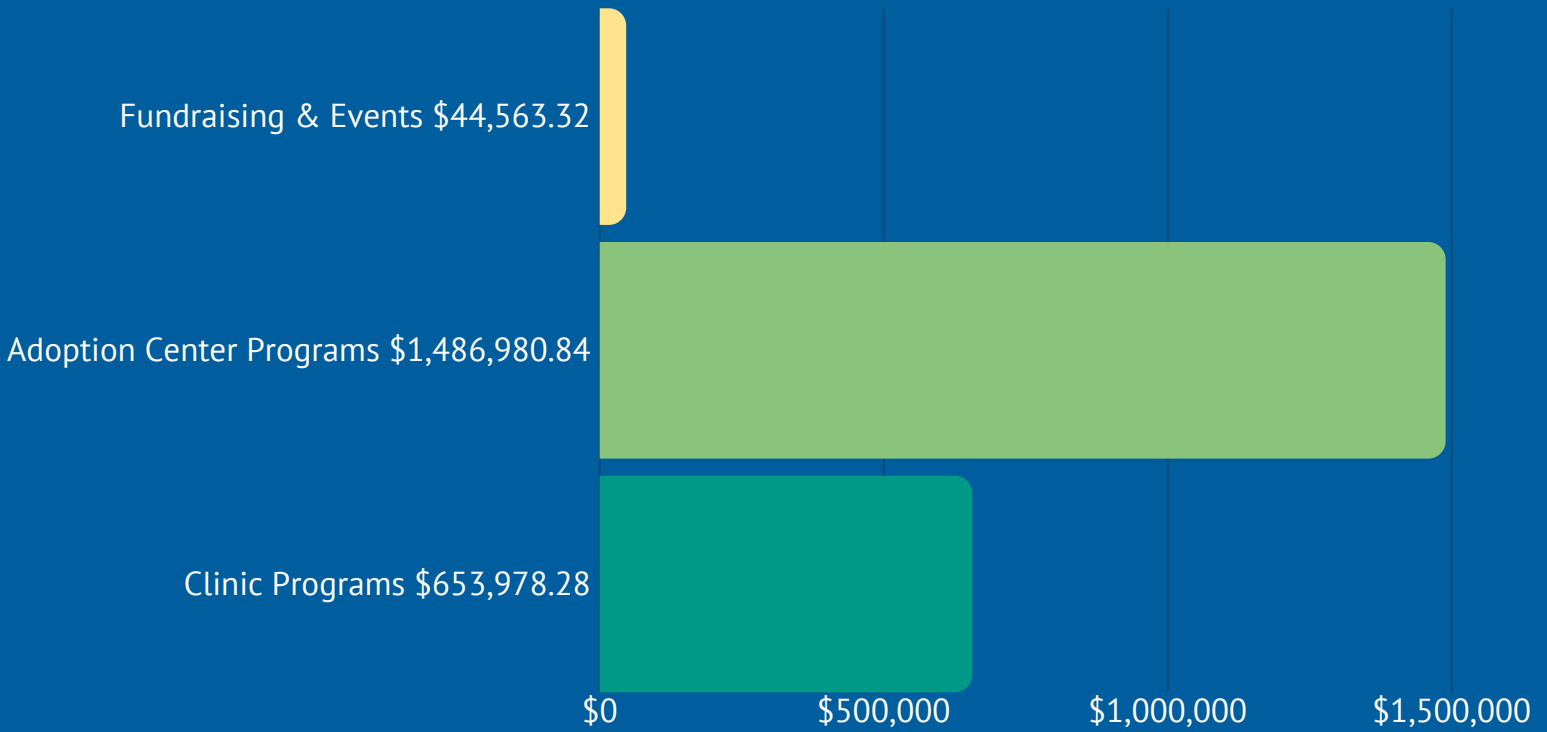
## WHAT SHELTERS DID WE PULL FROM?

We pull (transfer in) animals from a variety of municipal shelters, here's the data:

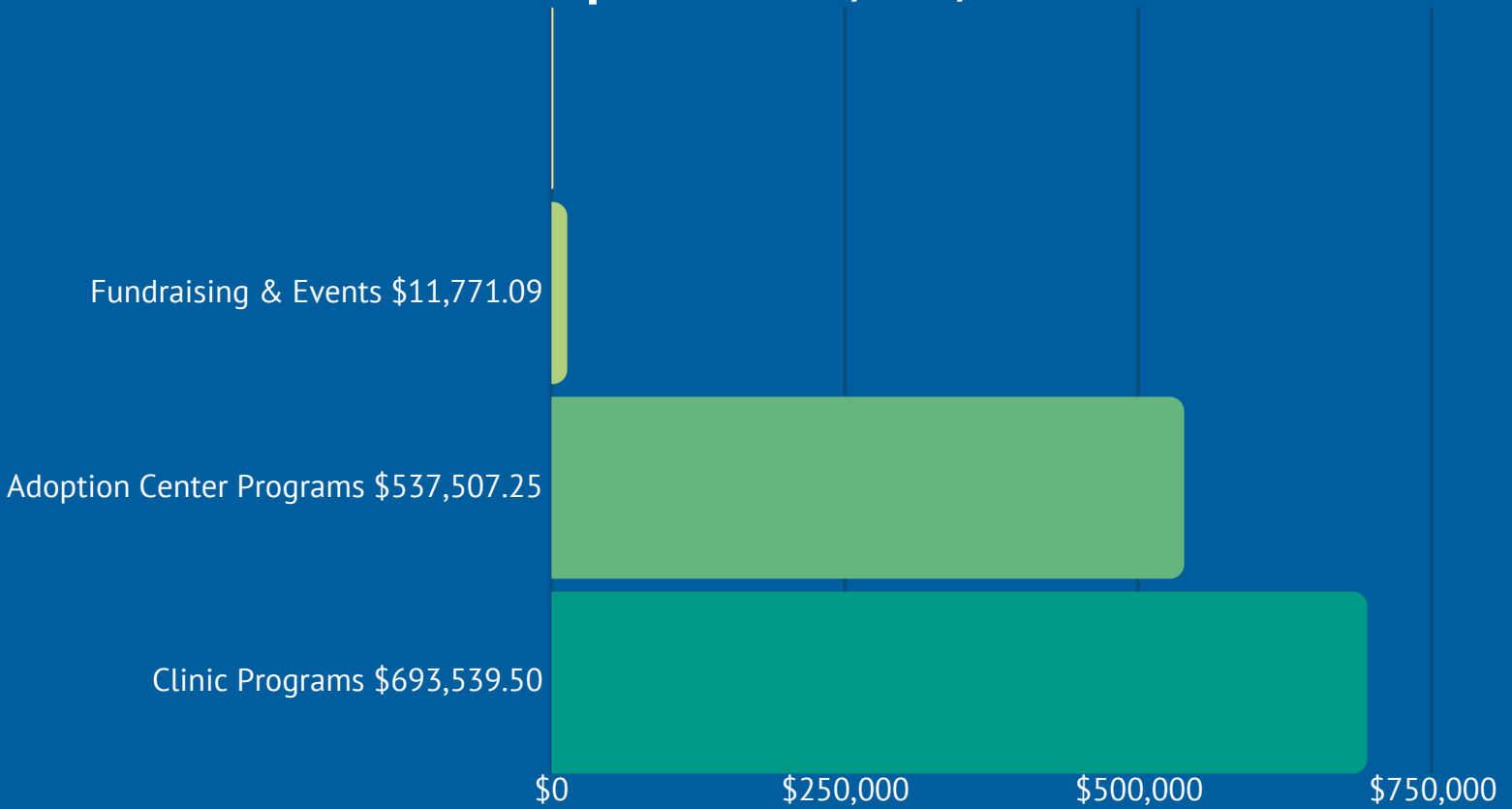

## Revenue \$2,185,522.44

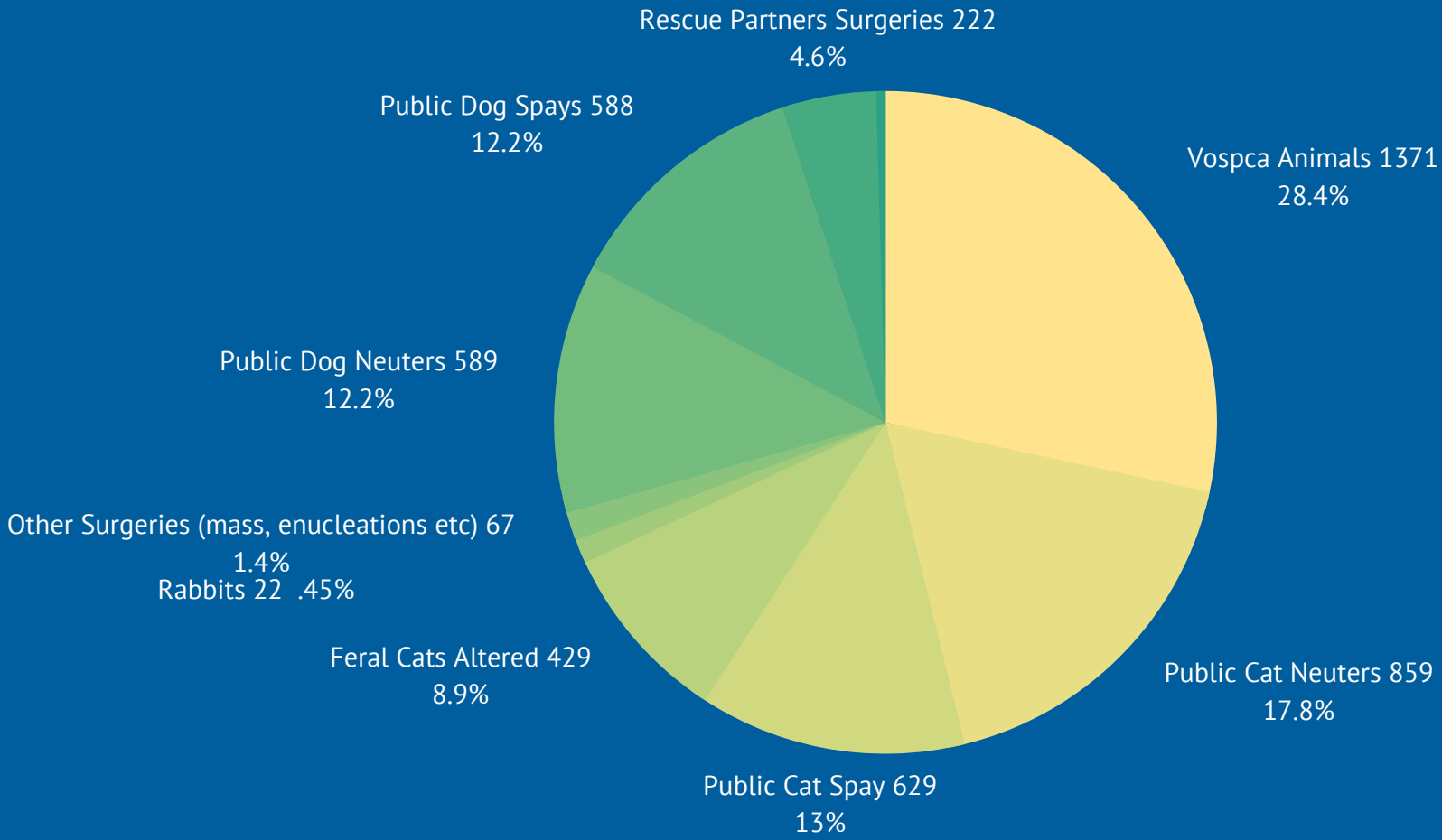


## Expenses \$1,242,817.84
